

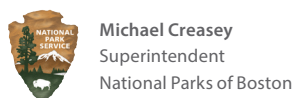

What Does My Ferry Ticket Include?

Ticket fares include round trip ferry passage to the park, plus any transfers to other islands. Once in the park, enjoy access to island visitor centers, exhibits, and free ranger-guided tours and activities. Tickets are not timed, and you can take any ferry to return. We recommend at least 4 hours to visit one island (including ferry travel), and a full day to visit two.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!

Have a safe, enjoyable trip and help preserve the park's natural and historic resources.

STAY SAFE

- Stay back from dangerous edges and out of fenced-off areas.
- Protect yourself from ticks and other biting insects by wearing repellent and staying on trails.
- Drink plenty of water and wear sunscreen.

BE AWARE

- Bikes and leashed pets are only allowed at Nut Island, Deer Island, World's End, and Webb State Park.
- Alcohol is prohibited unless part of a permitted event.
- Swimming is permitted only in designated areas on Spectacle Island (lifeguarded in July and August) and Lovells Island (not lifeguarded).
- Public ferries and emergency vessels have right of way on island docks.

BE PREPARED

- Pack for changing weather, as it can be cooler and windier on the islands.
- Bring a refillable bottle – there is drinking water on Georges, Spectacle, and Peddocks Islands.
- Know when the last ferry departs the island.

LEAVE NO TRACE

- There are no trash cans on the islands. We are a carry in / carry out park!
- Observe wildlife from a distance, and never feed them.
- Leave what you find – including plants, animals, and artifacts such as sea glass – for others to enjoy.

Don't miss the spooky Legend of the Lady in Black at 12:30pm and 2:15pm. Rotating special programs bring the Fort to life, from living history programs to Civil War-era music and authentic vintage baseball games.



LIGHTHOUSE TOURS

Experience the lighthouses of Boston Harbor Islands National and State Park with a special three-lighthouse tour.

Voyage through maritime history on this two-hour cruise with views of Long Island Light, Graves Light, and Boston Light: America's first light station. Onboard narration provided by park staff and volunteers from the United States Coast Guard.

Tours leave twice a day on Saturdays and Sundays between June 29th and September 28th, with additional sunset cruises on select Fridays throughout the season.

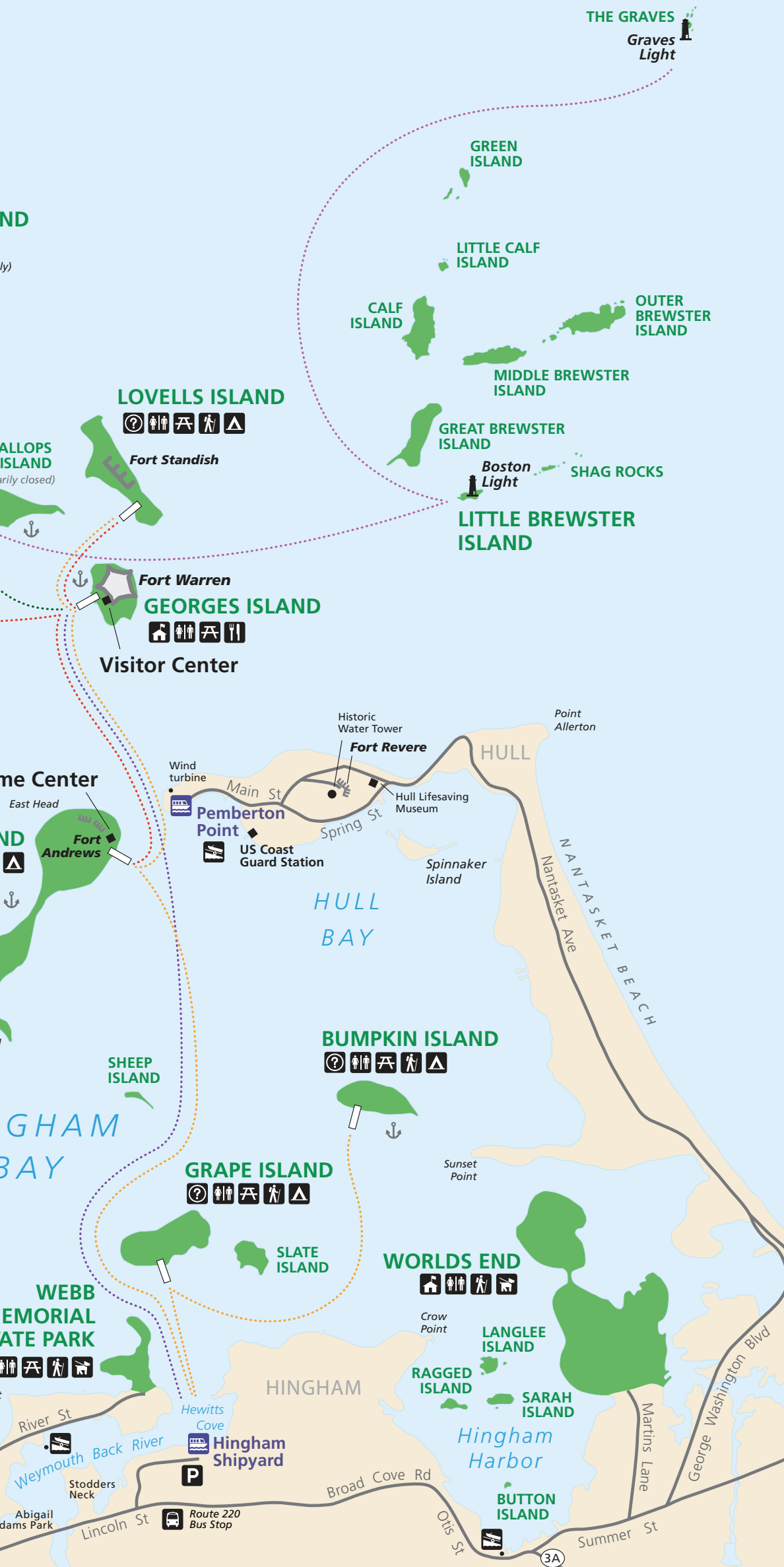
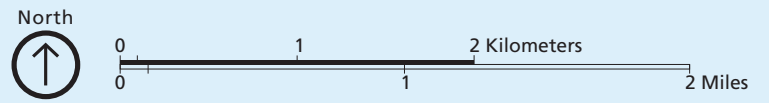
The Boston Harbor Cruises Ferry Center is located on Long Wharf North, between the Marriott Long Wharf Hotel and Christopher Columbus Park. Paid parking is available in nearby garages next to the New England Aquarium and in Boston's North End. The closest MBTA Station is "Aquarium" on the Blue Line.

HINGHAM SHIPYARD / HEWITTS COVE

28 Shipyard Drive, Hingham, MA

The Hingham Intermodal Center is located in the Hingham Shipyard complex on Route 3A. Parking is free for island visitors. Arrive 20 minutes early to pick up a parking pass. The MBTA 220 bus and MBTA ferry from Boston provide service to the Shipyard.

Take Your Boat

The Boston Harbor Islands offer a wealth of opportunities for boaters to enjoy the harbor using their own vessels. New moorings at Spectacle, Georges, Peddocks, and Gallops Islands (with no island access available at Gallops) can now be reserved through the DOCKWA marine reservation system, along with the slips at the marina on Spectacle Island. The Hingham Harbormaster also manages a number of moorings near Worlds End and Langlee Island. Visit the park website at bostonharborislands.org/boating for details on hours of operation and reservations.

Boaters are permitted to “touch and go” at most island piers, but public ferries have priority on all public access floats. Dinghies for public use are available at Georges, Spectacle, Peddocks, Bumpkin, Grape, and Lovells Islands. For emergencies on the water contact the US Coast Guard on VHF Channel 16.

Islands To Visit

History, sandy beaches, family activities or serene, wooded trails – it's your pick when planning a day on the harbor. Hit each of our top four destinations before the summer is over.

GEORGES ISLAND

Georges Island is home to historic Fort Warren, a Civil War-era fort known for its granite archways, dark tunnels, and grassy parade ground. Have a picnic (grills and picnic tables available), take a ranger-led tour, or visit the exhibits to learn about the history of the fort and its role in defending Boston Harbor. Georges Island features many free programs and activities, and also serves as a jumping-off point for other islands.

Trip Suggestion: Boats leave from Boston and Hingham (No advance reservations for Hingham tickets). If planning to visit two islands, start your day early from the mainland.

PEDDOCKS ISLAND

One of the largest and most diverse islands in the harbor, Peddocks Island features historic structures, scenic vistas, hiking trails, unique geologic features, beaches, and salt marshes. Throughout history the island has been home to Native Americans, U.S. military, prisoners of war, farmers, fishermen, and summer vacationers. This island is off the beaten path, and well worth the visit.

Trip Suggestion: For a full-day trip, take the 9am ferry from Boston and the 4:10 ferry back from Peddocks. Or, catch one of several connecting ferries from Georges. Pack a lunch – Peddocks Island has water fountains but no food service.

SPECTACLE ISLAND

Just 20 minutes from downtown Boston, Spectacle Island is ideal for hiking, swimming, learning, and relaxing. Hike to the highest point in Boston Harbor for panoramic views of city and islands, go for a swim at one of the cleanest urban beaches (lifeguarded during peak season), or just grab an Adirondack chair on the porch and watch the day pass by. The Visitor Center features exhibits about the history and evolution of the island, and ranger-guided programs are available every day.

Trip Suggestion: Spectacle's low-grade, crushed-gravel trails are great for runners and are friendly for strollers and people who use wheelchairs. Take the gam boat from Boston and you'll feel like you have the island all to yourself.

LOVELLS ISLAND

Spend your days relaxing on a remote beach and nights camping under the stars while listening to the sounds of the harbor. Put on your water shoes and wade along a rocky beach, explore tide pools, or bird watch near the sandy dunes. You can also tour the remains of Fort Standish and take in the distant views of the outer islands and Boston Light. Be mindful of fenced-off habitat areas for nesting birds.

Trip Suggestion: Take a boat to Georges and then grab a connecting ferry to Lovells. Pack a lunch and bring your own water – there is no food or water available on the island.

CAMP ON THE ISLANDS

WHY: Nature with an urban twist! Where else can you camp near the water and look out at the Boston skyline? Take in the sunset over the harbor, dine under the stars, and wake up to the sound of chirping birds.

WHEN: June 21 – Labor Day

WHERE: Peddocks, Bumpkin, Grape, and Lovells Islands

HOW: Visit bostonharborislands.org/camping to book a campsite! Regular sites accommodate four people. Group sites accommodate up to 25 people. Yurts (wood and canvas tents) accommodate six people. Camp sites are accessible by boat only, so book ferry transport in advance. Peddocks and Lovells Island sites are available 7 days a week. Grape and Bumpkin Island sites are available Friday and Saturday nights.

HIKE THE HARBOR

Peddocks Island: East Head

Length: 1.75 miles round trip

Time: 1 hour


Terrain: Paved path

From the pier, set out for a walk past the historic remains of Fort Andrews, an Endicott era fort used during World Wars I and II. Follow orientation signs to scenic overlooks, mortar pits, and the Visitor Center, with interpretive panels along the way.

The Boston Harborwalk

Length: approx. 43 miles

Terrain: Paved walkways

Catch great views of the harbor when you explore any of nearly 43 miles of public walkways that make up the Boston Harborwalk. From Dorchester to East Boston, look for the blue Harborwalk signs () and you'll be on your way. Visit bostonharborwalk.org to help you find public amenities – such as restrooms, park spaces, and wifi – along your route.

Spectacle Island: North Drumlin

Length: 3 miles round trip

Time: 1.25 hours

Terrain: Crushed gravel

From the Visitor Center, walk along the well-marked interpretive path to the top of the North Drumlin, the highest point in Boston Harbor. Be rewarded with views for miles! Make sure to stay on the trail as you make your way back down. For a shorter walk and views of the island, try the quieter South Drumlin trail.

Deer Island: Perimeter Trail

Length: 2.6 miles (loop trail)

Time: 1.5 hours

Terrain: Paved path

Accessible by car and public transportation. This trail is dog-, stroller- and bike-friendly. Enjoy up-close views of logan airport and the Boston skyline, and learn about the Deer Island Waste Water Treatment Facility.

Food Service

Enjoy everything from casual bites to an evening clambake on the Boston Harbor Islands this summer.

Salty's welcomes visitors to two snack bars within the park, with locations on Spectacle Island and Georges Island. Snack bars feature concession windows with outdoor seating and are located next to island visitor centers. Menus include classic concessions fare as well as daily specials inspired by New England favorites.

SUMMER CONCESSION HOURS

Georges Island (June 21 - September 2) – 11:30AM - 4PM

Spectacle Island (June 22 - September 2) – 10:30AM - 4:30PM

Concessions will also be open on Opening Day (May 18) and Memorial Day weekend (May 25-27)

During the spring and fall when no food service is available in the park, visitors can purchase food onboard island ferries or in advance from one of many vendors near Long Wharf North and at Faneuil Hall Marketplace.

In addition to regular concessions, Salty's offers weekly sunset clambakes on Thursday nights. Check the online park calendar to make a reservation for these special evening events. **Interested in booking your own event on the islands?** Salt Water Events can help to make your celebration truly memorable. FREE ACCESS FOR GROUPS: The park's Free Access Program sponsors nearly 15,000 ferry rides each year for eligible non-profit camps and community centers. This program is supported by Boston Harbor Now, the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation, the National Park Service, and Boston Harbor Cruises, with generous support from corporate and individual donors. Applications are accepted every spring at bostonharborislands.org/freeaccess.

FREE FERRY DAYS: Join us on opening day on May 18, on Free Fun Friday sponsored by the Highland Street Foundation (August 9), or on October 13 (the final weekend of the season) and enjoy a free trip to the park. Check the park calendar for details!

COMMUNITY CRUISES: Boston Harbor Now hosts approximately 12 free cruises each year to create opportunities for residents in Boston's waterfront neighborhoods to learn about and enjoy their harbor.

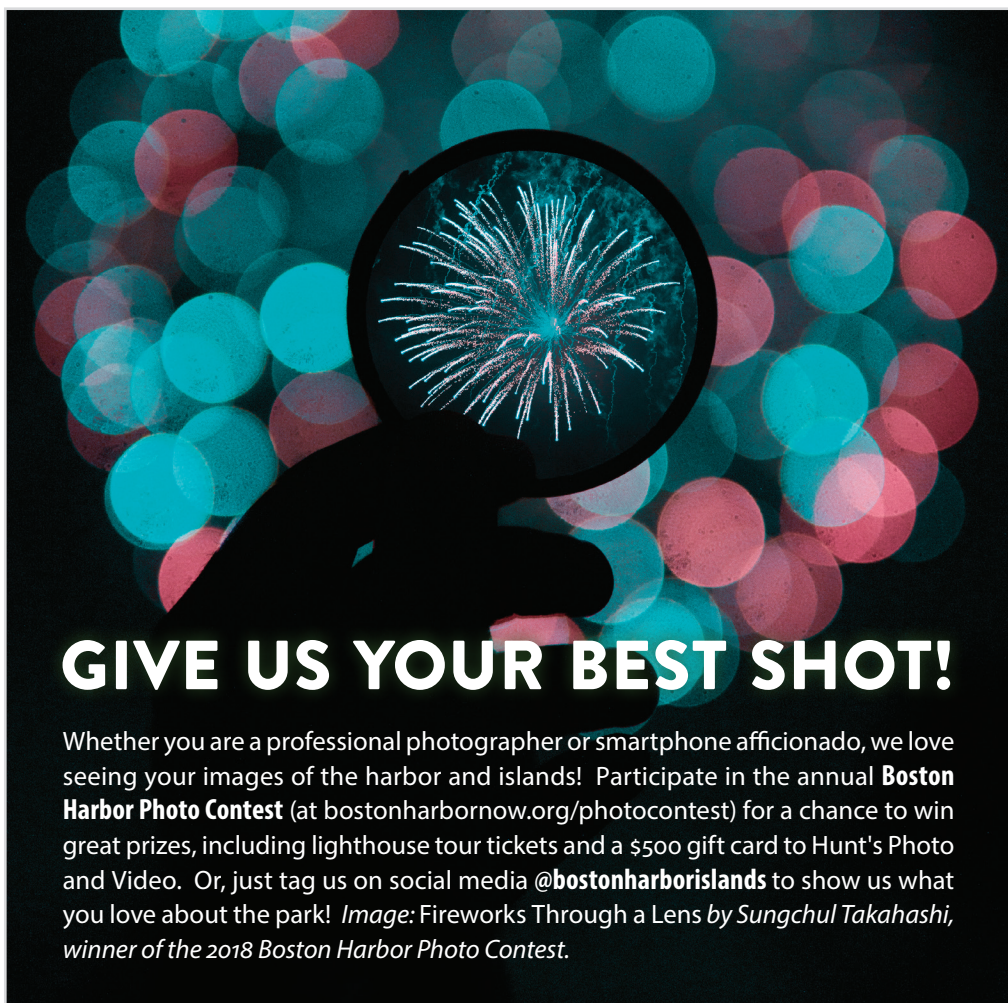
